

SHIP RADIO STATION LICENCE CONDITIONS

1. The Licence is not transferable.
2. The licensee/licensees shall comply with all the provisions of the Radio Regulations annexed to the Constitution and Convention of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) which relate to mobile stations and the station shall be worked in conformity with such provisions and also in conformity with the relative provisions of the International Telecommunication Regulations annexed to the Constitution and Convention of the International Telecommunication Union.
3. In so far as the rules relative to wireless telegraphy made from time to time by the Minister for Marine under the Merchant Shipping (Radio Installations) Rules, 1983 and amendments and Merchant Shipping (Navigational Equipment) Rules 1985 and amendments, and the Merchant Shipping (Radio) Rules, 1992 for the time being in force shall apply to the ship in question the licensee/licensees shall comply in all respects with these rules.
4. The Station shall only be used to send messages and signals to other stations of the mobile service and to receive messages and signals from other stations of the mobile service.
5. The licensee/licensees shall screen or isolate all dangerous areas of the station in such manner as may be necessary to ensure the reasonable comfort and health of operators.
6. The Station shall be worked only by operators holding Certificates issued or recognised by The Commission for Communications Regulation.
7. The licensee/licensees shall not receive by means of the station messages not intended for receipt thereby and if any such messages shall involuntarily be received at the station the licensee/licensees shall not divulge the existence or the contents thereof to any person (other than duly authorised officials of the Government of Ireland or a competent legal tribunal). The licensee/licensees shall exhibit at the station a copy of Section 11 of the Post Office (Protection) Act 1884.
8. The licensee/licensees shall keep full accounts records and registers of all messages sent and received by means of the station and in such registers each of such messages shall be accompanied by its identifying number and date and full particulars of its place of origin and of ultimate destination and such further particulars as The Commission for Communications Regulation shall from time to time reasonably require to be shown. The licensee/licensees shall preserve all used message forms written and printed and transcripts of messages and all other papers for such period as is from time to time prescribed by the International Telecommunication Regulations annexed to the Constitution and Convention of the International Telecommunication Union and such registers and message papers shall be open to the inspection of The Commission for Communications Regulation or its officers thereto authorised at the registered office for the time being of the licensee/licensees or at such other place as may be agreed between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on every day except Sunday or a statute or general holiday.
9. The licensee/licensees shall render to the relevant Accounting Authority such accounts as the relevant Accounting Authority shall direct in respect of all charges due or payable under the Constitution and Convention of the International Telecommunication Union in respect of messages exchanged between the station and coast stations and shall pay to the relevant Accounting Authority at such times and in such manner as the relevant Accounting Authority shall direct all sums which shall be due from the licensee/licensees under such accounts.
10. The frequencies and types of emission employed by the licensee/licensees shall be specified in the Licence.
11. The Commission for Communications Regulation and its officers and authorised agents may at all reasonable times enter upon the Station for the purpose of inspecting the wireless installation.
12. This Licence together with any other document which The Commission for Communications Regulation may prescribe as necessary shall be carried on board the ship. The Licence shall be available for inspection when required by competent authorities of the countries where the ship calls.
13. The licensee/licensees shall forthwith pay to The Commission for Communications Regulation for and in respect of the Licence hereby granted the sum of €3.80 and in addition thereto the appropriate renewal fee on the 1st January in each year during which the Licence falls due.
14. This Licence may be revoked and determined at any time by The Commission for Communications Regulation by notice in writing to the licensee/licensees and shall henceforth cease determine and become void but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy which shall have accrued or shall thereafter accrue to The Commission for Communications Regulation under any condition or provision herein contained.
15. The expression "Constitution and Convention of the International Telecommunication Union" means the Constitution and Convention signed at Geneva 1992 and the International Telecommunication Regulations and Radio Regulations made thereunder and includes any Constitution and Convention and Regulations which may from time to time be in force in substitution therefor or in amendment thereof.
16. This Licence covers the apparatus for wireless telegraphy on lifeboats carried by the ship; the ship; and the use of such apparatus in emergency subject to the conditions contained in the Licence except condition 6. Such apparatus shall comply in all respects with specifications laid down by the Minister for the Marine from time to time. It also covers the radar equipment, radar transponders, satellite communication equipment, emergency position indicating radio beacons and radio navigational aid equipment.
17. Any Licence or Permit heretofore granted by The Commission for Communications Regulation to the licensee/licensees in respect of the Station is hereby revoked.
